

RE focus - How can people show they belong together?

Knows some of the things that makes them unique and can talk about some of the similarities and differences in relation to friends or family. Sequences family members, explaining who they are (baby, toddler, child, adult) Can identify the role of the emergency services in society and knows how to call for help.

Talks about what they see in the school grounds and local area

Communication and language

Can name some 2D shapes-circle, rectangle, triangle, square.

Can mix primary colours to make secondary colours and use in their own work

Draws faces with features

Makes use of a variety of resources- loose part play.

Names and explores a wide range of instruments.
